THE FAWCO FOUNDATION NEEED SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Investing In Our Most Important Resource - PEOPLE - Through Higher Education

Each year The FAWCO Foundation awards Development Grants to projects nominated by FAWCO member organizations. The grant categories are aligned to the UN Millennium Goals.



In 2007, *The Lambs Project* was awarded the “A Place to Learn” Development Grant. Working through “The Friends of Burkina Faso” the grant bought lambs, school books and gas lights for little girls entering school in Burkina Faso. The girls in the Lambs Project raise and care for the lambs and after a year, they sell the lamb and with their profits finance their schooling and buy another lamb for the next year. This process continues throughout their school careers.

50 little girls in Ouahigouya received lambs as a result of the Development Grant.



This program strongly resonated with FAWCO Member Clubs and there was interest in aiding these girls beyond their secondary school educations.

In 2008, at FAWCO Member Clubs’ request, The FAWCO Foundation started searching for an opportunity to team with a needs-based scholarship program. Through The Friends of Burkina Faso we learned about the NEEED (Nimbus, Enfance, Environnement, Education et Developpement) program providing scholarships for post-secondary education studies for girls in the fields of primary school teacher training, nursing, midwifery and university studies. The young girls who had completed their basic education with support from the Lambs Project DG were now thirsty for further education but could not afford it; these were the very girls who would benefit from a NEEED scholarship. It was decided that NEEED was a perfect fit due to FAWCO’s past association with the Lambs Project.

The NEEDED initiative was announced at the 2010 FAWCO Conference in Boston and immediately members donated funds in lieu of retirement gifts, birthday celebrations and memorials. The overwhelming response allowed The FAWCO Foundation to underwrite the education of nine girls, starting in September 2010. In 2011, the donations to NEEDED consisted almost entirely of donations made in memory of Pam Dahlgren. In 2012, the donations were, again, primarily from individual members. In 2013 and 2014 donations grew substantially and were received from individuals, trusts and FAWCO Member Clubs.



Since 2010, The FAWCO Foundation has financed the complete education for 34 young women to become teachers, midwives, nurses or to acquire university degrees in business, law, engineering or other profession that will directly benefit their village upon completion.

The FAWCO Foundation NEEDED Scholarship covers the cost of tuition and school fees, books, supplies and living expenses for the entire period of their studies. While the costs vary from year-to-year and with exchange rates, these were the costs for post-secondary training in September 2014:

Two-year Primary School Teacher degree \$1,638

Three-year Nursing or Auxiliary Midwife Training \$3,510

Three-year University Degree \$9,360

Many of these young women have left their villages to live near their schools. These fields of study require a multi-year commitment from the students. After they receive their degrees they will return to their villages to help nurture and improve the lives of a population in dire need.

The FAWCO Foundation receives periodic updates on the students and their progress is reported on The FAWCO Foundation website: www.fawcofoundation.org At the conclusion of their studies, The Foundation receives final reports and information about their career plans.

There are dramatic statistics that compel us to support education and training in these three professions:

1. The literacy rate (those over the age of 15) is only 26%
2. Infant Mortality is a staggering 97.1 per 1000
3. Life expectancy is a mere 56.7 years of age

Our Next Students - How YOU Can Help Them Realize Their Dreams

The first five years of our partnership with NEEDED have been very successful and The FAWCO Foundation hopes to continue this important program.



The number of scholarships given will be based on the amount of donations we receive by June of each year.

In 2014, FAWCO Member Clubs, trusts and individuals donated a total of \$41,878 provided for three university degree scholarships, three teacher education scholarships and three nursing scholarships.

We continue to collect donations for this program and look forward to offering more girls from Burkina Faso a chance at higher-education.

According to the International Monetary Fund, Burkina Faso is one of the world's poorest countries ranking 157 of 181 countries. Higher education is a struggle to achieve even in the more urban and developed parts of the country.
